Phase One Of Multi-Phase Renovation Complete

Work on phase one of the \$6 million renovation and construction project on the Downtown Senior Center and other offices of Senior Services is now complete, and programs and services have been busy in recent weeks moving back into the center.

The Downtown Center has reopened with a new billiards room and new classrooms, as well as a refurbished multi-purpose room.

The Senior Employment Program now enjoys front-door accessibility for clients, as well as expanded areas for applying for positions.

Work on the new Meals on Wheels kitchen and staff building was completed in March. The new kitchen is much larger than the previous one, which should enhance the capabilities of the program to serve more clients as well as offer some flexibility in menu selection.


The campaign to finance all three phases has raised just over \$3.8 million, with \$300,000 needed to complete updates on the exterior of the center and \$1 million needed to add the formal event center, expanded computer center and small cafe for the Downtown Senior Center.

To introduce donors, dignitaries and other



supporters to the new space, a progress party is planned for Thursday, July 19, from 5 to 7 p.m.

The spring job fair held March 20 drew 105 job seekers eager to visit with the potential employers on hand at the semi-annual event sponsored by Senior Services.

The next senior employment fair will be August 21 in the newly-remodeled Downtown Senior Center.
