HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS

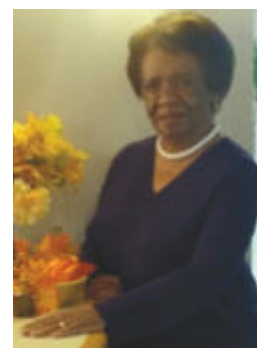
May 25, 1955, an F5 tornado tore through the tiny town of Udall, Kansas, at 10:35 pm without warning. It left few buildings still standing and nearly 20% of the town's population dead or injured. It was one of the deadliest tornadoes in Kansas history.

Quilters' Treasures quilt group (QTs) was started in 1991 by a group of women to make quilts for survivors of another tornado, this one in Andover, Kansas. The group continues to this day at the Northeast Senior Center, making baby quilts for family shelters and scented hearts for premature babies in neonatal intensive care units.

As the 65th anniversary of the Udall tornado approached, the QTs decided they should make a commemorative quilt for the Udall Historical Museum. Several members have family connections to the town.

Frances Williams (Miss Frances) provided the inspiration for the 60" X 98" quilt. Her mother had quilted and taught her daughters to quilt. When Miss Frances' sister passed several years ago, she found the pattern pieces for a house quilt at the sister's house and gave it to the QTs.

The house has been a traditional quilt pattern since pioneer days and is still used for its home-and-heart motif. The QTs added modern techniques and a range of vintage to contemporary fabrics, using old sewing machines and computer-driven machines to construct the quilt. The 24 house blocks are surrounded by a black printed fabric like dark storm clouds, and the swirling quilting pattern is reminiscent of the tornado's wind.

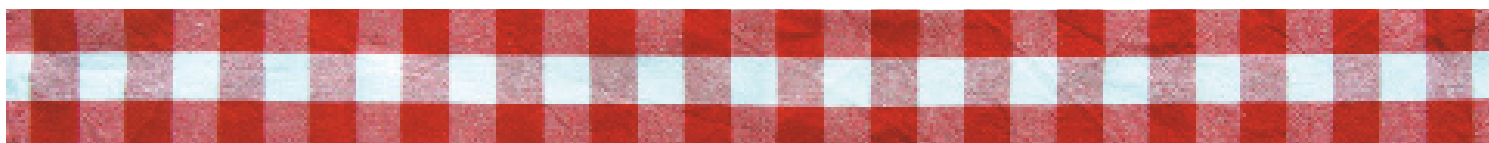
