Happy September and Happy Senior Center Month!

The National Theme for Senior Center Month is "Strengthening Community Connections" but we also wanted to put our own little spin on the title and add "Party Like It's 1968" which is when Senior Services of Wichita began (credit to Cherise Langenberg for the new theme). We are 54 years young this year and going strong. In the Fall of 1968, a group of area Ministers came together to determine the needs of seniors living in the downtown area. They opened the Senior Activities Center at 115 E. First Street as a drop-in site for people to socialize and exchange information. The Activities Center hung a simple bulletin board announcing volunteer and employment opportunities in the community. Today, Senior Services operates 4 multi-purpose Senior Centers across the city. Thousands of seniors utilize at least 1 service, program or event at the centers each year.

Senior Services also provides Meals on Wheels and delivers around 800 to 900 hot, nutritious meals to homebound seniors each week day. On the weekends 100 meals are delivered to the most frail, isolated and at risk of institutionalization. **Continued on pg 19**
